## Key Stages

The above fees reflect work we would expect to undertake in respect of a straightforward application, which would usually include the following steps:

- Taking initial instructions from our client;
- Advising on process, requirements and timing;
- Assisting with preparation of the application;
- Reviewing supporting documents; and
- Submission of the application.

The cost for immigration applications can vary depending on the complexity of the issues involved. The information provided above is intended as a guide only. Should you instruct us on any type of immigration work we will ensure transparency and provide you with estimated costs which reflect the specific facts of your case.

Our fee scopes are calculated according to time spent, based on our hourly rates. Current hourly rates for the team are as follows:

Legal Director - £360 plus VAT

Associate - £200 plus VAT

Trainee - £140 plus VAT

Paralegal - £125 plus VAT

At the outset of an instruction the scope of our work, next steps and an estimate of fees for the work will be provided to you in an engagement letter accompanied with our standard terms and conditions of business.

## Disbursements

The most likely disbursements are the Home Office application fees payable upon submission and the Immigration Health Surcharge for use of the NHS by a migrant worker. The Immigration Skills Charge will also be payable by a business sponsoring a worker in many cases. These will be payable in addition to any legal fees incurred, as outlined above.

Disbursement costs are dependent on a range of factors such as the complexity of the application, type of application, and the urgency of the application. It is challenging to determine from the outset of an application every disbursement which may arise, but the Home Office has provided useful guidance of fees likely to be incurred. Sponsorship licence fees for employers depend on whether you are considered a '*small or charitable sponsor*' or a '*medium or large sponsor*'. An employer would usually be considered a charitable sponsor if they are a registered charity in England and Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland and would usually be considered a small sponsor if at least two of the following apply:

- your annual turnover is £10.2 million or less;
- your total assets are worth £5.1 million or less; or
- you have 50 employees or fewer.

Depending on what type of entity you are will determine which fee below is payable to the Home Office as part of your application. Please note that the Home Office fees are subject to change.

Further disbursements may also be incurred if interpreters are required, if document certification is required, or if further specialist immigration advice is required from an immigration barrister. Barrister fees vary according to the level of experience of the barrister instructed and the complexity of advice given. In any event, these fees would be discussed with you before being incurred.

## Timescales

Timescales for advising on and preparing the application will depend on the type of application being made and the circumstances of each matter. We will endeavour to keep you updated with how your application is progressing and the likely timescales.

We cannot guarantee how long the Home Office will take with any given application. Currently the Home Office indicates that most visa applications are being decided on within 3 weeks after the appointment at the visa application centre, however we would advise that clients plan for it to take up to 3 months. We would expect applications for a sponsor licence to take between 4 to 8 weeks, but it may be longer, particularly if the application is complex.
